Memorial Day Salute

In honor of Memorial Day and my uncle's (Vietnam Marine) recent passing, let's take a moment and remember the physical, psychological and ultimate sacrifices that our Veterans and their families have given so that this country can continue to be the most free industrialized nation in the world.

How many soldiers died in WWII in the same amount of time as in Iraq? The number of US casualties in this conflict is 1/100 the number of casualties from WWII. A conflict that lasted (U.S. involved) from December 7, 1941 to September 2, 1945. On D-day alone (one day) the U.S. suffered a loss of 4,696, which is almost more than the entire Iraq conflict.

Our enemy in the war on Terror is no less vicious and actually even more hostile towards the U.S. than were our past enemies. A death toll of 1 is bad and is a terrible loss, but in perspective, can we allow ourselves to be so blind and mollycoddled that we do not understand the meaning of sacrifice? In WWII around 10% of U.S. Population (133.4 million) was directly involved with the military in one capacity or another. Now, out of a population of approximately 400 million we are looking at the least involvement in our security (half of 1%) in our country's history.

Remember the sacrifice gives honor to those whom have paid the price of our freedom. Below is a compilation of statistics of the conflicts that this country has been involved with since the colonial wars.

Fuel Prices Effect More...

It isn't just our pockets that taken the hit for getting to work and to have the ability to play. A lot of wildlife and forestry management groups are straining under the stress too. On average and rounded, for 2006 a moderately sized management group used approximately 8,300 gallons of gas and 1,800 of diesel fuel in a year.

The cost of State game land management was a hot topic for the Colorado Department of Transportation Fiscal Year 2008-9 Joint Budget Committee Hearing. The Pennsylvania State Game Commission does not receive any general state taxpayer dollars for its annual operating budget. It is funded by license sales revenues, the state's share of the federal Pittman-Robertson program (an excise tax collected through the sale of sporting arms and ammunition) and monies from the sale of oil, gas, coal, timber and minerals derived from State Game Lands.

So, anticipate the cost of the licenses to rise. Carpool anyone?

PA State/Local Legislation

At the end of April 2008 the Board of Commissioners of Lower Chichester Township, Delaware County, PA, proposed an ordinance that would require a buyer, seller, owner, tenant or applicant to divulge whether there is or will be any firearms or ammunition (i.e. handguns, rifles, shotguns and gunpowder) present prior to the sale or lease of any private property. According to this ordinance, those involved will be subject to penalties if they do not send a copy of the required application to law enforcement detailing the type and number of firearms and the type and amount of any ammunition or gunpowder. This ordinance is in direct violation of the State's preemption law.

The preemption law sustains uniformity and control of laws passed by the state legislature. In this instance it sustains uniformity of state gun laws, which keeps municipalities from passing gun control laws that are more restrictive than those voted for by the state legislature. This law has also been recently debased by the City of Philadelphia, PA. www.nraila.org/Legislation/

Be Prepared for Weather Extremes

Summer brings the threat of storms, power outages, floods, and tornados. We are already in a record setting year for damaging tornados. A reminder has been delivered by emergency management officials as variable spring weather spreads across Pennsylvania.

The Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency (PEMA) and the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) recommends that people should store at least a three-day supply of non-perishable foods or foods that require no refrigeration, preparation, or cooking and little or no water (avoid salty foods, as they will make you thirsty). If you have cans in your emergency supplies/storm kit make sure you include a manual can opener and let's not forget to mention eating utensils.

PEMA suggestions / recommended emergency supplies include:

- Protein or fruit bars
- Dry cereal or granola
- Peanut butter
- Dried fruit
- Nuts (unsalted)
- Crackers (unsalted)
- Canned juices
- Non-perishable pasteurized milk
- Vitamins
- Food for infants

Be sure to include one gallon of water per person per day for at least three days, for drinking and sanitation. Baby wipes are a nice water saving/hygienic short-term alternative if you are not able to shower. Consult PEMA and the DHS to ensure you are prepared for a possible emergency. The PA Department of Health offers links to a host of Flood Disaster, Safety, & Recovery Resources.


